Grant amount requested.</p> <p>Please indicate estimated total cost of activities included within the project and whether project requires annual funding to be maintained.</p>	<p>£250</p> <p>To replace the hedge that is largely dying, with suitable native trees and shrubs. To plant some wild flower areas and plant the border in front of the hedge with perennials that attract butterflies and bees, and will have flowers for as long as possible throughout the year.</p> <p>To link up the wildlife corridor from the river Eden to the top of the village</p>
<p>6. How will you show that your project is successful and how will you keep it going in the future?</p>	<p>Flowers, including wild flowers, trees and shrubs will flourish. We hope to have a bioblitz there to check on the current situation and repeat that in two years to see if it has improved. Local residents will look after the area. As these are perennials, shrubs and trees, annual funding of the same sum will not be needed.</p>
